

## What to expect from Accommodation on farms

Farm accommodation is often very basic, as with anything there is varied standard of accommodation from the very good to the not so good. Most farms offer mobile homes, these are normally 3 bedrooms, with 2 people in each room so a total of 6 sharing, but you can get larger or smaller units. They are normally self contained (own shower / toilet / kitchen and living area), but some can just be for sleeping and may only have part of the facilities and then separate facilities for either cooking /washing or both are provided.

Some camps use porta cabins, these are normally just for sleeping and then separate cooking and washing facilities are provided.

All camps are normally self catering, so you buy and cook your own food. You need to remember to take your lunch / drinks to the fields when working, unless you are told you are working close to the camp that you can return there in breaks.

You normally need to bring a sleeping bag / pillow / sheets and you will need your own towels. Most of the time cooking equipment / plates / pans / cutlery is provided, but you may sometimes have to buy a few bits and pieces.

Washing machines are normally provided on site, these may be coin or token operated, and you normally have to provide your own washing powder.
